AFC personnel aid in storm damage cleanup

LITTLE ROCK – The Arkansas Forestry Commission has a chainsaw crew from Forrest City working in Earle to cut downed trees to be hauled away.

AFC crews from Craighead, Conway, Lonoke, Perry, Pulaski, St. Francis and Van Buren Counties worked with emergency service personnel Friday and throughout the weekend to remove fallen trees and debris from roadways in the wake of Friday's severe weather outbreak.

On Friday, AFC personnel from Conway County provided assistance near Birdtown and Highway 9 in northern Conway County. Crews from Van Buren County cleared roadways near Gravesville, and later Morganton.

Personnel from Pulaski and Perry Counties were aiding efforts at Hensley, and Grant County crews are worked to clear debris south of Sheridan. A chainsaw crew from Stuttgart was been dispatched to provide assistance in Carlisle.

On Saturday, chainsaws crews were working in Carlisle and Earle.

AFC chainsaw crews from Forrest City, Jonesboro and Stuttgart were dispatched Monday to aid in cleanup efforts in Earl, Etowah and Carlisle.
